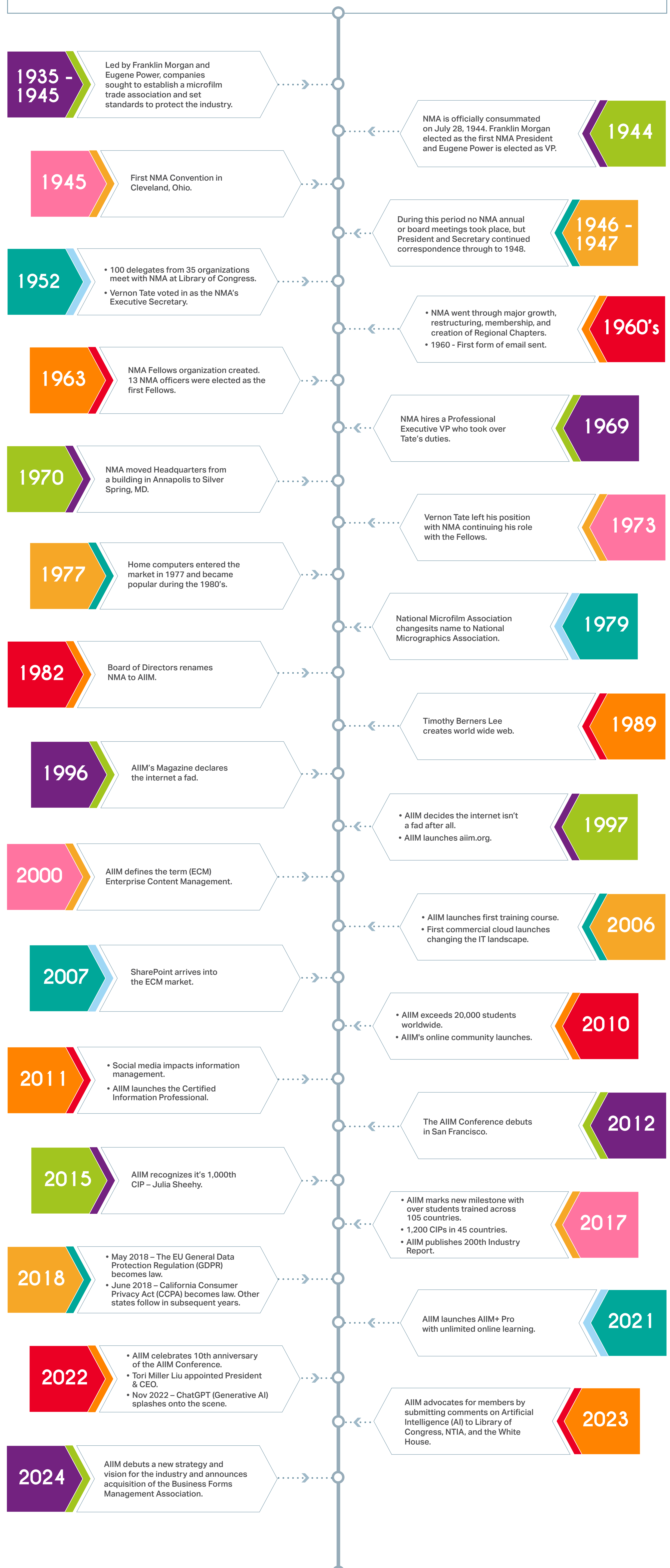

About the Timeline

Much of this timeline is based on a priceless collection at the University of Michigan. In December 1982, Dr. Vernon Tate donated a large collection of manuscripts and publications documenting the history of microphotography and his own career as a historian, archivist, librarian, and microfilm pioneer to the University of Michigan Libraries. This donation provided the impetus for the creation of the Power Library for the Study of Scholarly Communication and Information Transfer in the Special Collections Library. The Power Library is named in honor of Dr. Tate's long-time friend, Eugene B. Power, the founder of the micropublishing firm University Microfilms, Inc.
